

DANIEL R. BANNISTER

Daniel R. Bannister

Mr. Bannister is President and Chief Executive Officer of DynCorp, an employee owned technology and aviation services firm headquartered in Reston, Virginia. He is a Trustee of The Falcon Foundation.

Throughout the past decade, he has served as DynCorp's President and Chief Executive Officer. In 1968, he led a group of company managers in taking the company private, installing an Employee Stock Ownership Plan. Today, with over 65 percent of its shares employee owned, DynCorp is one of the largest employee owned companies in the United States. DynCorp's employees represent a broad range of professional and technically skilled personnel ranging from scientists and engineers to computer systems specialists and management personnel - they are involved in aviation, computer operations, systems integration, weapons system testing, environmental assessment and logistic support activities.

DynCorp has two principal businesses: an airline services activity that provides support to airlines at over 60 airports throughout the United States and one in Russia; and a technology and technical services activity that supports 31 U.S. Government agencies, as well as foreign governments and commercial firms. DynCorp's annual sales were over One Billion in 1994 and expected to increase to approximately \$1.2 Billion in 1995.

Mr. Bannister is extremely active in local and nationwide community services and in professional education affairs. In addition to his Falcon Foundation appointment, he is Chairman of the Northern Virginia Technology Council (an association of approximately 225 technology service companies); the Vice Chairman of the Employee Stock Ownership Corporation; a Trustee of the American Management Association; and a member of the Northern Virginia Roundtable. He serves on the Boards of the Fairfax County Chamber of Commerce, the Northern Virginia Community Foundation, the George Mason University Foundation, and the Easter Seal Society of Washington, D.C. and Maryland. He previously served as Chairman of the Board of the Combined Health Appeal and Director of the Fairfax Symphony.

In 1992, Mr. Bannister received the Washington Technology High Tech Entrepreneur of the Year and the Reston Board of Commerce's Best of Reston Man of the Year Award. In February 1994, he received the Fairfax County Captain of Industry Award. He is the recipient of an honorary Doctorate in Humane Letters from Marymount University and has received the 1993 Northern Virginia Community Foundation Founders Award.

He and his wife, Paula, reside in McLean, Virginia.
