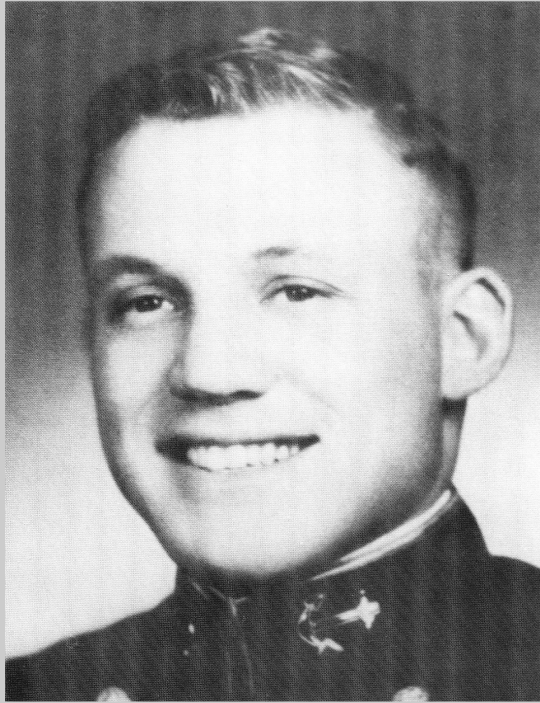

Lieutenant Charles Eric Jenkins is missing following take-off on a night flight from Palomar Airport, California, on 29 August 1984. The plane he was piloting disappeared without trace.

Eric graduated from the American School in Monterrey, Mexico, before attending Millard School in Oregon. He was admitted to the United States Naval Academy in 1962, graduating in 1966. His choice of the Naval Air Arm was followed with assignments to Pensacola N.A.S. for

basic training and to Meridian, Miss. N.A.S. for jet pilot certification. He was asked to remain there as a Flight Instructor. He was next assigned to Miramar N.A.S., where he qualified as an F-8 Fighter Pilot and served a tour as Flight Operations Officer before being assigned to the USS Hancock for combat duty during the Vietnam War, 1970-1973.

Eric returned to civilian status in 1973, serving as a pilot with Western Airlines until his tragic disappearance in 1984.
