

Falcon Foundation Dates in History Gifts to USAFA by the Falcon Foundation

- 20 Mar 1968: The music for "Bring Me Men" was given to USAFA.
- 6 May 1966: The "Gallery of Great Airmen", 67 portraits, was given to USAFA.
- 8 May 1987: A 15 ft bronze eagle was given to USAFA and placed on the trail between the Visitors Center and the Chapel.
- 15 May 1960: Bart Holaday was offered a Falcon Scholarship, attended prep school at New Mexico Military Institute, entered USAFA, and graduated with the Class of 1965, and became the first Falcon Foundation Rhodes Scholar.
- 16 May 1986: Nine Paintings by Shlomo Katz were given to USAFA for the Jewish Chapel.
- 26 Jun 1959: First three Falcon Scholars entered USAFA with the Class of 1963.
- 16 Aug 2005: The Murray Green Papers, documenting the life of Hap Arnold were given to USAFA Library.
- 20 Aug 1962: Dan Twomey was offered a Falcon Scholarship, attended University of Santa Clara, entered USAFA, graduated with the Class of 1967, and became the second Falcon Foundation Rhodes Scholar.
- 7 Sep 1993: The life-size bronze statue of General H.H. Arnold was given to USAFA and placed in front of Arnold Hall.
- 28 Sep 1958: The Falcon Foundation was incorporated and the first Falcon Scholars began prep school.
- 28 Oct 1983: The "Gallery of Secretaries" was given to USAFA for the Library.
